



### **TOGGLE MUTE/UNMUTE:**



# What to Wear



- Comfortable layers of clothing
- Comfortable shoes
- Wake Dems or General Democratic Party Gear

- A cell phone with a charged battery and saved contact information
- A folding chair or stool (check with the site captain if will be provided)

# When you arrive



## Parking

- Park away from the polling location entrance
- Leave parking closest to the door for voters

## **X** Locate the Wake Dems Table

- Look for the Wake Dems tent, table, or signs
- Introduce yourself to fellow WCDP volunteers, the NCDP Voter Protection volunteers (if there are any at your site)
  - Introduce yourself to the your fellow volunteers at the table and at the location
  - Let them know you're there for your shift

# When your shift starts



## **Solution** See Mindful of the Buffer Zone

- There will be Board of Election signs showing the buffer zone
- ALL greeters, signs, and literature must be a specified distance from the entrance
- y Usually 50 feet, sometimes 25 feet
- The Wake Dems table should be located near the voter entrance, and along the path most traveled, but don't block the sidewalk

## Curbside Voting Information

- Once a car has entered a space in the Curbside Voting area, you cannot approach
- You can approach cars in line to enter a Curbside Voting space, but wait for an invitation
- Pepending on # of volunteers, focus on the foot traffic

# What's on the Table?



# Always have the following on the table (or handy)

- ★ The Early Voting binder/notebook or Election Day Packet
- ★ Pens and volunteer forms
- ★ Translated slates in the plastic sleeves and/or acrylic holders
- ★ Slate cards to hand out

# No other campaign or candidate material

- Properties of the only thing being handed out
- A small amount of candidate-specific lit was provided and included in the kit; it stays there unless a voter specifically asks to review a piece of lit from a specific candidate
- Candidates and campaigns may stash their belongings and extra materials UNDER the table while they are there, but they may not put it on the table

# **Greeting Voters**



### Offer a slate/info card to voters

- Position yourself *next to* the main pathway into the polling place (**but do not block it**) and ask voters if they would like a slate card
- For example: "Hello! Would you like a Democratic Party Slate Card? It includes information on our endorsed candidates for the non-partisan races too! Remember to start at the back of the ballot."

**If yes:** "Excellent, thank you for coming out to vote today! We have many ways to get involved in the party after the election too!" "If you could bring your slate card back to reuse we would appreciate it!"

*If no:* "Okay, thanks for voting today!"

# **About Bonds or Referenda**



## Nake Dems is NOT taking a formal stand on ANY bonds or referenda

- → Do not offer your personal opinion on these, especially for municipal bonds/referenda
- Simply say, "WCDP is not taking a stance on this."
- → If asked about the statewide Constitutional Amendment, say the following: "The Democratic Party has no formal stance but groups like Democracy NC and Common Cause have suggested voting 'no'."

# **Greeting Voters**



# Thank them for voting + reusing the slate card\*

- When the voter leaves, thank them for voting and ask for the slate card back
- For example: "Thank you for voting today!" or "Thanks for coming out today!"

\*NOTE: If a slate card goes into the trash, by law it cannot be reused.

### Ask them to volunteer

- If the voter seems receptive, ask them if they would like to volunteer with us
- For example: "Would you be willing to volunteer with WCDP in the future and help get more Democrats elected?"





# **Supplies**

- Slate cards, volunteer sign-up sheet, and a supplies kit (for Early Voting) or packet (for Election Day) will be supplied by your EV Site or ED Poll Greeting Site Captain
- If you're running low on slate cards, contact your EV Site or ED Poll Greeting Captain
- You may want to set up a recycling box that voters can drop their used slate cards in

## **iii** Restrooms

- Some polling locations will have restrooms available for you to use, some will not
- Check with your site captain or ask one of the poll workers before entering the building



## Voter Traffic

- Voter traffic can fluctuate dramatically
- The last few days of Early Voting and Early Voting weekends are generally busier
- For weekdays, before or after traditional work hours, during lunch breaks, and after school tend to be busier

## **%** Voter Reaction

- Some people will be happy to see you others may be grumpy (De-escalation strategies will be discussed in the next section)
- Many will simply be indifferent to your presence

## Only WCDP materials may be on the table

We will provide a candidate lit lookbook, but *no other campaign or candidate literature is allowed on the table*.

### **Candidates**



Many Democratic candidates will visit various polling sites to campaign by the WCDP table. This is welcomed, and they may also ask to temporarily store a backpack, box, etc **under** the table.

# Do's





Keep smiling, even in the face of grumpy people. Remember, you are making a positive difference and many people are grateful that you are there. Your calm and polite response to a grumpy voter creates a positive impression of both you and the Party.

## **V** DO

Keep your chair and personal items nearby so you can easily sit down when time permits, but always be able to get in position to greet new voters.

# **Endorsed Candidates**





## While volunteering as a Poll Greeter...

- We only promote Democrats who won their partisan primary and who are WCDP endorsed nonpartisan Democrats
- You may disagree with an endorsement, but during poll greeting we are one Party united behind our endorsements
- Our motto is "Begin on the Back of the Ballot" because we encourage voters to vote the ENTIRE ballot!

# Don'ts to remember



- **DON'T** stump or actively campaign for candidates that are **not** on our endorsed candidates list while volunteering as a poll greeter.
- **DON'T** approach cars in the **Curbside Voting** area. Once a car has entered that area, we are not allowed to approach.
- **DON'T** retrieve slate cards or other lit from the trash. Once in the trash, by law it must stay there.
- DON'T respond to attempts by people to engage you in debate this distracts you from greeting other voters. If other people try to challenge and intimidate voters, let the poll observer know, or call NCDP Voter Protection / tell the Site Manager / Chief Judge what is happening.
- **DON'T** allow other organizations or candidates to put materials on the WCDP table or distribute other literature other than our slate cards.\*

# Don'ts to remember



\*It is critical that we do not coordinate with other organizations and potentially give the appearance that organizations are in coordination, so while Poll Greeting just distribute the WCDP Slate Card.

Posted on NextDoor, 2022 General Election Period

I went to vote at Chavis Park day one of early voting. As I walked up to the building, I was stopped at the Wake County Democratic Party table and asked if I wanted the Wake Democrats' Voters Guide with candidates they endorsed. I said yes. The nice older lady explained the paper she handed me and then stopped and said she had an important addition. She then handed me the [Other Group] Endorsement list, said that it differed from the print out she had previously handed me, but didn't bother to explain the group, why she was handing me the pamphlet, or why it differed. If I wasn't politically active and already aware of this group... I would've thought it was an official addendum to the official endorsed candidates list.

# At the end of your shift



## • Wait for the next volunteer(s) to arrive

- The volunteer(s) on the next shift should arrive 15 minutes prior to the end of your shift
- If they do not arrive on time, contact the site captain.
- If you cannot reach the site captain, call or text WCDP at 919-916-5641

## When they arrive

- Greet them and provide an update on how things are going.
- Point out the Buffer Zone and Curbside Voting area.
- Also, ask them if they have any questions or concerns before you leave

# At the end of your shift





## Don't forget your things

- Remember to grab any drinks/snacks, chairs, umbrellas, or any other items that you brought.
- Please throw away any trash.

# Thank you!

- Thank YOU for volunteering your time for such an important task!
- Poll greeters are the last people voters see before entering the polling place.
- Help voters make an educated decision, encourage them to vote for our candidates, and thank them as they leave.

# De-escalation Training





- (2) "Who are you?"/ "Why are you here?" and additional talking points
  - Your presence may be questioned and while this is uncommon, be prepared!
  - As long as you remain outside of the buffer zone and are not harassing or intimidating voters, you are allowed to be there.

## **OPPOSE OF SECTION SEC**

- You will likely encounter poll greeters for the "other" side.
- Be polite, but firm about your presence. And if they try to engage, don't. No need to be distracted.



## > How to respond to challenging situations

- Pe calm but firm and assert your right to be present.
- **\*** Establish clear expectations and boundaries:
  - Please stop engaging with me, I have a job to do.
  - Stop engaging with me, I don't feel comfortable with your harassment.
  - You're encroaching on my personal space, and I need you to move away from my area.
  - I will ask the site supervisor (EV) or the Chief Judge (ED) to get involved, please stop continuing your harassment.
- Create physical barriers with table, chairs, signs, pop-up tent to establish clear boundaries.





# IMPORTANT! 🚨





If harassing behavior continues, ask for the Site Manager or the Chief Judge in the voting site:

- **Explain the issue**
- Communicate you asked for the behavior to stop
- Ask for a specific resolution: "I'd like you to ask for them to stop this behavior, and if it escalates to ask them to leave the property because of their harassment"
